2024 Grierson Award for the Best Science Documentary

The Grierson Awards are the UK's biggest documentary event, honouring innovative and exciting documentaries from around the world.

The Awards evening

The process of short-listing documentaries for different genres begins over the summer and in September I was informed by the production crew that the Jennings documentary was one of four international documentaries shortlisted for the Science category. Award evening took place on Wednesday 6 November and the production team invited me to be with them at the event to represent Carol and the family. We were pleased just to be nominated and could attend the ceremony, never dreamt that we might win. The `best "Science. Documentary' was the first to be announce and I was led me up to the stage to be introduced to the large audience (over 500 individuals involved in the TV and film industry. It was both a moment to be proud of Carol but also for me very emotional.

Carol and her work in Dementia

Carol's father was diagnosed in 1982 with Alzheimer's as were a number his siblings in the 1980s. Her work of identifying research teams to look at her family really began in earnest during our time at Keyworth (1988-1997). The actual genetic fault was discovered 1991. You all at Keyworth Methodist church were very supportive of us as a family during this very stressful time. We were so pleased that the church figured briefly in the documentary as Carol and I shared in worship with you. Images submitted include the notice of the award, the Judges



assesment of the documentary's merits and the final one is the documentary team with me at the event's photo shoot. The young woman in the red jumpsuit is Niamh Kennedy, who was both the producer and editor. They worked on the filming, interviewing over a period of three years and Niamh. almost became an extension of our family.
